Building liveable, sustainable, and prosperous cities, strengthening and empowering local governance, and involving local leaders in promoting the culture of peace and harmony in the diverse cities of the Middle East, are the

center of MDN's work. The same acronym also reflects the corporate principles of MDN: M for Mission; D for Dedication; and N for Neutrality. 

Interview with Murat Daoudov, President of the Middle East Development Network.

MDN PROPOSES A NEW PLATFORM FOR COOPERATION AND EXCHANGE BETWEEN THE MIDDLE EAST AND THE REST OF THE WORLD.

New European Economy: Who founded the Middle East Development Network and where is it based?

Murat Daoudov: "I founded the Middle East Development Network (MDN) with assistance and involvement of a number of successful professionals from various countries. MDN proposes a new platform for cooperation and solutions exchange between the Middle East and the rest of the world. Our company's headquarters is in Istanbul, the world's traditional meeting point—East and West, North and South, and the past and future."
